

If you would like to study as a full-time student in the United States, you will need a student visa. There are two nonimmigrant visa categories for persons wishing to study in the United States. These visas are commonly known as the F and M visas.

You may enter in the F-1 or M-1 visa category provided you meet the following criteria:

- You must be enrolled in an "academic" educational program, a language-training program, or a vocational program
- Your school must be approved by the Student and Exchange Visitors Program, Immigration & Customs Enforcement
- You must be enrolled as a full-time student at the institution
- You must be proficient in English or be enrolled in courses leading to English proficiency
- You must have sufficient funds available for self-support during the entire proposed course of study
- You must maintain a residence abroad which he/she has no intention of giving up.

1. F-1 Student Visa

The F-1 Visa (Academic Student) allows you to enter the United States as a full-time student at an accredited college, university, seminary, conservatory, academic high school, elementary school, or other academic institution or in a language training program. You must be enrolled in a program or course of study that culminates in a degree, diploma, or certificate and your school must be authorized by the U.S. government to accept international students.

2. M-1 Student Visa

The M-1 visa (Vocational Student) category includes students in vocational or other nonacademic programs, other than language training.

3. Employment

F-1 students may not work off-campus during the first academic year, but may accept on-campus employment subject to certain conditions and restrictions. There are various programs available for F-1 students to seek off-campus employment, after the first academic year. F-1 students may engage in three types of off-campus employment, after they have been studying for one academic year. These three types of employment are:

- Curricular Practical Training (CPT)
- Optional Practical Training (OPT) (pre-completion or post-completion)
- Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) Optional Practical Training Extension (OPT)

M-1 students may engage in practical training only after they have completed their studies.

For both F-1 and M-1 students any off-campus employment must be related to their area of study and must be authorized prior to starting any work by the Designated School Official (the person authorized to maintain the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS)) and USCIS.

McDougle Technical Institute is a SEVP-certified accredited vocational school.

All international students interested in studying with McDougle Technical Institute will need to apply for the M-1 Visa.

Applicants who are not citizens or permanent residents of the United States are considered international students. All international students interested in studying with McDougle Technical Institute will need to apply for the M-1 Visa. In application for an M-1 Visa, McDougle Technical Institute is authorized to issue a Form I-20. The following are steps that you must order to successfully enter into the United States to begin studies with McDougle Technical Institute.



Dear International Student:

Welcome to McDougle Technical Institute. We are delighted that you decided to apply for admission.

Applying to McDougle Technical Institute as an international student is simple. Below you will find an outline of the admissions requirements, documents needed, international student application and a guide on what to do after you apply. If you have any questions or concerns, be sure to contact us right away for an answer.

STEP 1: APPLY TO McDougle Technical Institute

After you speak with an International Admissions Advisor and decide on the program you want to enroll in, you will fill out the application and submit the necessary documentation to process your Form I-20. (Please note all documents must be translated to English by a certified translator)

- 1. International Student Application
 - Completed application with signature.
- 2. Official Education Records through highest level completed are required. Photocopies must be certified by the school attended, the

Ministry of Education in native country, or the US Consulate. Scanned or faxed copies are not acceptable.

- High School Diploma or General Equivalency Diploma (GED) All applicants must have the equivalent of a US high school diploma.
- 3. Evidence of English proficiency
- 4. Evidence of financial support
 - Confidential financial statement on the application must be completed and signed by financial sponsor.
 - Bank statement, scholarship, or loan approval indicating that there are sufficient funds to cover the "total cost of education" (tuition, fees, books, living expenses, transportation, and incidental expenses). Each dependent will require additional funds in the amount of \$7,000 US dollars.
- 5. Copies of current passport. Copies of current I-20, visa, and dependent's passport, if applicable.

Each Friday, the International Admissions office will review **completed** International Student Applications and notify the applicant by mail of the decision. *Evidence of health insurance is required after admission. An insurance compliance form will be mailed with the acceptance package.*

INTERNATIONAL TRANSFER STUDENTS

Students transferring from any other educational institution within the U.S. to McDougle Technical Institute MUST submit official copies of ALL previous education transcripts, in addition to the application, the US\$100.00 nonrefundable application fee, a copy of the current I-20 form from the student's current school, along with all other requirements stated above transfer students must also request a transfer evaluation and pay a US\$100.00 nonrefundable evaluation fee,

STEP 2: OBTAIN THE FORM I-20 FROM McDougle Technical Institute

Once your application is complete, McDougle Technical Institute will issue the initial attendance I-20 through SEVIS. The I-20 will to your international home address.

STEP 3: PAY THE SEVIS I-901 FEE

The Department of Homeland Security has implemented a \$200.00 SEVIS I-901 Fee. Please be advised that McDougle is not involved in the administration of this fee. It is your responsibility to make this fee payment directly to SEVP (Student and Exchange Visitor Program). For more information regarding this fee, you may visit https://www.fmjfee.com

STEP 4: APPLY FOR AN M-1 VISA AT THE US EMBASSY/CONSULATE

After you receive your I-20 and pay the SEVIS fee, you will need to visit the US Embassy/Consulate in your home country to obtain the M-1 Visa.

STEP 5: ARRIVE IN THE US THROUGH THE PORT OF ENTRY

Upon arrival in the US, you will need to be approved entry into the United States through the Port of Entry. To be approved, you must possess a valid M-1 Visa, Form I-20 and passport.

STEP 6: BEGIN STUDYING AT McDougle Technical Institute

Once you've arrived in the United States, you will check into the campus, go through orientation and begin your studies.

*The application process, as outlined, will be slightly different if you are a Change of Status or Transfer student.

GRADUATING STUDENTS

When students graduate from McDougle Technical Institute they must either transfer within sixty days to another college, apply for optional practical training, or return to their country. Students who fail to do this will be out of status with the United States Citizenship and Immigration Service (USCIS).

ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

All International students must meet all of the following academic regulations and standards of performance to remain enrolled in McDougle Technical Institute

- 1. Register as full-time students in a minimum course of study of at least 18 hours per week of instruction.
- 2. Maintain satisfactory attendance and academic progress.

International students who do not meet academic standards for any term will not be permitted to attend subsequent terms and the I-20 will be terminated with the USCIS. Students will be administratively withdrawn by the institute.
